

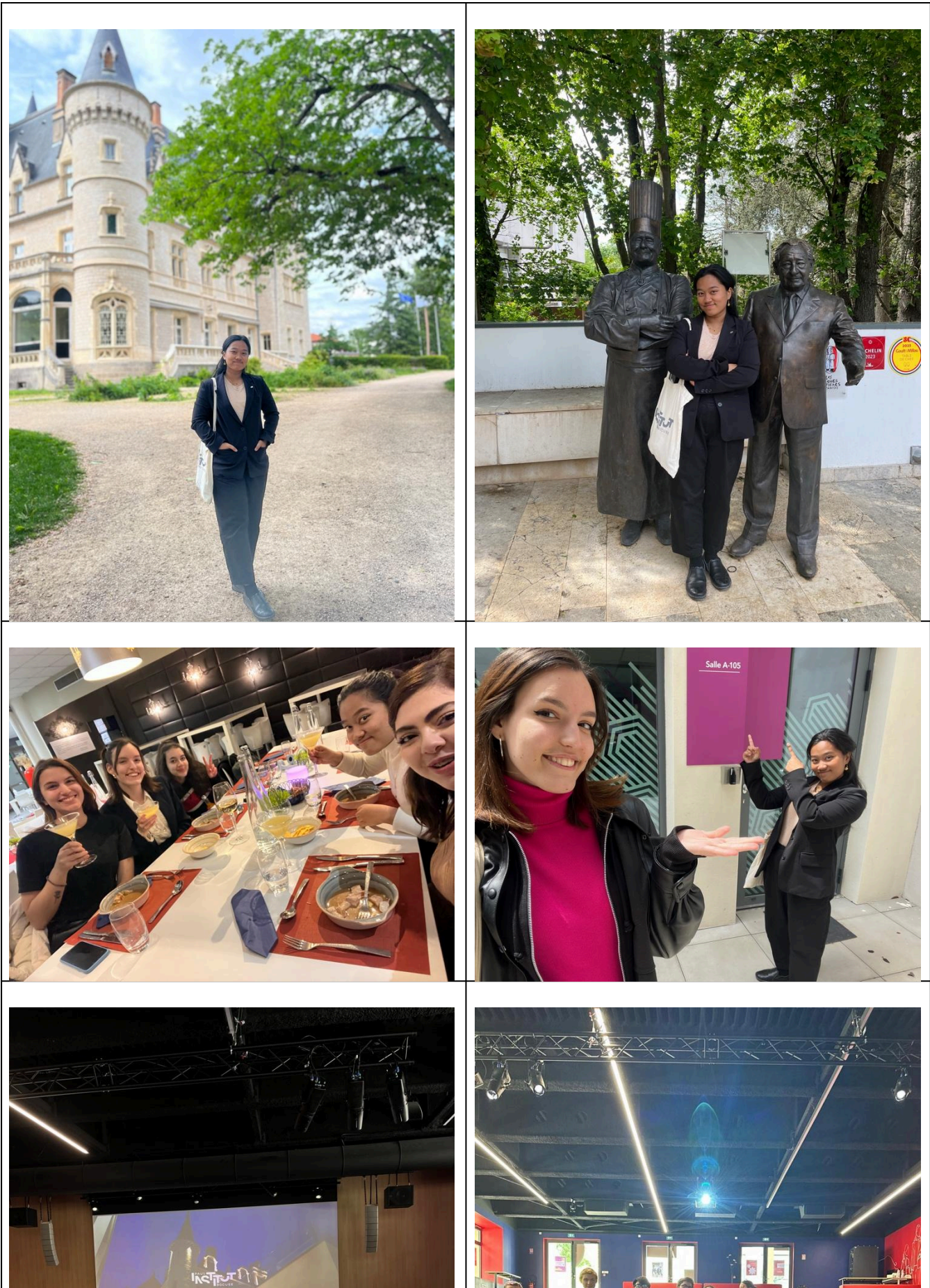

해외 학교생활및 학과공부: Please describe your school life and the courses that you took. It's a small school so, everyone knows each other, I have met and made friends from different majors and classes. Everyone is friendly and always eager to get to know you, even if you meet for a brief moment. The professors are like your friends, they teach from experiences and talk to us in a discussion form, many case studies and groups works. Classes: Performance Management – Divided into 2 classes Performance Forecasting – its basically a math class, that predicts sales in hotel HR Management - how to create training plans and manage staff conflicts Experience Design – Divided into 2 classes Experiential Marketing – creating compelling marketing using senses, story and creating experience for customers Design Thinking – creating an experience and efficiency for customers by revising touch-points Intro to Entrepreneurship – Divided into 2 Classes Entrepreneurship – learning about components to consider when openings business Hospitality Law – learning about types of laws and what laws to think about in hospitality industry Meetings and Event – learning about types of events in hospitality industry and creating an unique event Sustainable Hospitality Management - Learning about how to be ecological and how to lower carbon footprints Applied Foreign Languages – French

<p>현지에서의 생활 (여행및 음식, ...) : Please describe your local life besides your studies (for examples, travel, food, ...)</p> <p>The school is situated in outskirts, about one hour away from from the city, so it’s really quiet. But the city is really beautiful (if it’s sunny) and people are very lively. I usually eat three meals at the school’s F&B, and they mainly serve french food, so I didn’t try out much food outside.</p> <p>As for traveling, I’ve only been mostly outside of France, because it’s much cheaper to travel outside. Within the country, I only visited Annecy, which is close to Switzerland, and it was worth it to travel. I travelled with other Erasmus students I met at school, so it was really fun.</p>
<p>해외 유학/교환학생 프로그램을 통해 얻은것들은? What were the benefits for you to participate in a study abroad program?</p> <p>I gain a lot of connections with the students, teachers and guest speakers. I have also learn a lot from courses I didn’t have at Woosong. The learning environment is really different, so I grew as a person I would say. Usually, I would be afraid to speak up about my opinions or even present in front of class, but these are the things I have to do on daily basis at IPB, so I think I have gain more confident.</p>
<p>해외 유학/교환학생 프로그램 참여를 준비하는 학생을 위한 조언: Would you have advice or tips for someone preparing for a study abroad program?</p> <p>I would say, don’t be afraid to try new things. Studying Abroad is an opportunity to explore new things you have never seen or experience, and it is probably one of the reasons why you were interested in the first place, so why not try. I would also advice not to be anxious about not having friends or being alone. There are a lot people like you who come to exchange program, and there are going be people who will be welcoming you. Lastly, be yourself, you don’t’ have to change to be ‘like-able’, you are always going to find people who will have same interests as you and people will understand you.</p>
